(Do the Arapahoes have names for those?)

No, I don't think so.

(They're not originally Arapaho?)

No, they're not. Originally the Snake Dance is from the Navajo tribe of New Mexico or Arizona. But, the Buffalo Dance is originally from the Comanche tribe.
