(Do you have any other songs you want to sing?)

I just about run out of songs. (Pause.) I thought of one of them Rabbit Songs the other day.

RABBIT DANCE SONG

(She sings a Rabbit Dance song)

That's the one.

(Is that a Rabbit song?)

Yeah.

(Does it have words to it?)

No. No words to Rabbit songs.

(There was about 10 minutes of irrelevant conversation which has been erased. Then Myrtle sings another Rabbit song.)

(Was that a Rabbit song?)

Yeah. That was Rabbit song.

(Do you know who made that song?)

It's all from the north. (Rabbit Dance introduced by a Blackfoot Indian.)

Oh, I just could imagine my boy dancing when I sing these songs! Boy, he used to just go up and down just like he was on a spring.
