That's how come we were able to do what our forefathers and our grandfathers had taught us--like my mother had taught me. That's why I'm able to do what I can today. And now, way back there when a man had his wife to do her beadwork, well, she might be going way down there somewhere to get some wood from the river, or she might be way off down somewheres. He has to be at the tipi watching her cooking. He's got to be able to know what to do. That's where it all come from.
