(Yeah.)

Well, somebody make a little short throw, you know, well, that puts the game in a run. Somebody hook it, you know. Then, they again--yeah, they can pick them up.

(Yeah.)

Throw them like that. Well, we had -- I think Ethel's got some.

(Well, maybe, I can see one of those?)

Huh?

(Maybe, she'd show me one of those things.)

I don't know where--(pause) Come here.

Unidentified voice: What?

Mr. Wheeler: Go tell your grandma if she could find them, you know, that got that buckskin string, you know, that woman's game. Well, she always put her things way over. (laughter)

(Yeah.)

Mr. Wheeler: Sometimes, she can't find them. See, they--they--she had two pair.

(Yeah, yeah. When the women play that game, and if one of them's got the---)

Unidentified voice: Grandpa, she's up stairs.

Mr. Wheeler: Huh?

Unidéntified voice: She's up there.

Mr. Wheeler: Oh, yeah. Oh, we'll get them sometimes.

(Okay. If one of those women's got that ball on a stick, can--can another woman grab it off of that stick?)

Mr. Wheeler: I think so.
