And he landed here and the American Indian welcomed him. If the Indian was so mean as they claim he is today, them would wipe them when they landed..would have wiped them off right there at the shore line. But instead..then finally the Quakers came in, Quakers came in that's where your Thanksgiving comes in. The Quakers and the Indians came together made a big feast everybody enjoyed eating, friendship there. Well, the Indian never thought never thought of trouble with the white man. Just let them go on. From the east was the Mississippi River there wasn't too many Indians, but on the west..of course there was some in the north in Minnesota, Wisconsin, in through there, just like I told, that's where we originated. That's where our people used to live, many long years ago. Then it was log days. They had big dogs I guess, great big dogs, to do all their packing. And the children I guess had to..get two poles and build them just like a nest..the kids used to ride in them things and the dogs used
