Well, you know my people was camping there, right close to Ft. Laramie they was camping there and the way I know the Colorado militia attacked them at night and killed lot of our people and our people wasn't prepared for that. Well, from then on it made my people..they wanted to take revenge, and so they sure did. They done lot of things. Every time they seen schooners traveling through they killed them off, burned and killed their horses, and maybe killed their cows, kill the whole family of them, killing them off. I think it was in their day a terrible life for them to know and to see. When I just sit here and think about it, it hurts in a way you know for one another to kill one another, but it goes on every day, every night. Sepecially in these big cities. So well, our people they just, they didn't want to fight. They moved on. And the government wanted them to come back to Colorado to Ft. Laramie. They went back and from Ft. Laramie, they made them move to over there by Guymon. And that's where we settled. That's where the Arapaho settled. And they already I guess they made their fences up and they had little patches for their corn, pumpkins and something to eat. And naturally the neighboring tribes, right in right close to them, the Utes used to live there and the Utes used to try to run these Arapahoes off..fighting over buffalo over that meat they were fighting. And finally the Arapahoes run them off. They went way back there to Colorado in the mountains. That's where they went. And today when I go out there, by George, they ask me, "What
