Pawnees are going to come here."

(Yeah, yeah.)

Which, you know-see, Mrs. Campbel is Pawnee, you know, Willis's wife.

(Yeah, yeah.)

Well, yeah, they set that day when they're going--when they're going to meet. They'll have a dance.

MORE ABOUT TOBACCO USED IN CEREMONY

(Yeah. And after that date's set, then, you take the tobacco up. Is that right?)

Huh?

(After the date has been set, somebody takes the tobacco up?)

Yeah.

(Do all the Wichitas go right away--when they take the tobacco, right?)
Yeah.

(Yeah. Well, what--what's it like when--when you give the Pawnee the tobacco? What do they do then?)

Well, they accept just like that Houston, you know. He accepts this tobacco, you know.

(Yeah.)

Well, and it's got a--it's a, you know. That's all, you know. That's about all that's done, you know. They set that day, and same time, you know, they're going to have feast, you know, same day.

(Same day. Do they smoke the tobacco then?)

Huh?

(Do they smoke the tobacco then right after they accept it?)
No, well, I guess, they used, you know, long time; but they don't ever,
do that.
