Young Dog Dance and Wolf Dance same thing. They call it Young Dog Dance, but we call it Wolf Dance here, Wichita. And they re-- and this is -- this goes too far back. We don't use it any more. They had a Deer Clan. (Joe, were the people in these clans--were they all relatives?) You have to join just like any way you go to church. (Yeah, yeah, I see.) You join them. (Yeah, I see.) They can't tell you. You just come on and join them. No, you got to-(Yeah.) I'll tell you towards the last, you know, when--about--about this Deer Clan. (Mmmm-hmmm.) But that's all the--see, they had clan. They had that Deer Clan, and (pause) -- the Ghost Dance, it's not -- it's not ours, but we use it. I think we got it from the Cheyenne-Arapahoes. (Monton - homoma.) It's not ours, but the old people used to use it, Ghost Dance. (Monton - homon.) And this Turkey Dance, they used it. Turkey Dance, you know, it s a woman's dance, you know. I used to -- I saw that dance long good many, years ago. ^ (Yeah.) They used to use it, but there was a -- one of my cousins, he returned

from the First War.
