(Is there much divorce or is there just separation?)

DIVORCE AND SEPARATION

Oh, there's just separation between married couples. They never actually get down and divorce on another. And some of them can stay separated for a number of years, and some of them remarry without getting a divorce. That's what you find among Indians, and I don't know how in the world. If it was a white person, usually they sue one another, but the Indians they don't.
