The mouth of it, then you blow like that, you know, you smoke it.

(Where do you put it when you...?)

Well, north, east, south, and west, you smoke it.

(Are you pointing the bowl, or the mouth of it when you point it to the ground?)

Mouth of it.

(0.K.)

Then we get through, then that man giving that Sun Dance, he brings bucket of water, we all take a drink. When you drink it, you put it on you, you know. I can't understand how the people drink that, but it never goes out, never.

(There's plenty in there.)

Plenty in there, yeah.

(Nobody seems to refill it, huh?)

Water everybody. And then the chiefs the only one that can put that Sun Dance up, you know. And they tie that roof on the top of that. It's laying—here's the center pole, the top of it's laying way over there—west. That boy that's giving that Sun Dance, he' ties bright color-calico, you know, top of it.

(Yeah.)

Like a blue bucket it's a aluminum bucket about that big around, tie that way in the top, too. And then we try to drag it so it will come to that place, can roll in. And we all get hold of that rope and some of the guys that start puttin' up that big old pole, you know. We'd all yell and everybody shout and we'd raise it up and have it straight up and down and then we'd pack it. And this man puts marks around that center pole, like a white paint, you know. He paints it. Not too high, round like that, you know. And this is just about gettin' dark, you know. And after that,

the headsman takes over. They either a sub-chief or a headsman.
