(Well, don't you stand closer together too?)

Yes, you stand closer together and then you lock arms mostly, whereas in a round dance, you don't.

(And it seems like to me that there are several circles of dancers that are going around too. Is that right?)

Uh-huh.

(Where do the singers stand?)

Well, they're right there. There the ones in the middle and they dance around too.

(Do the other people sing?)

Yes, the drummers, they start the songs and then the ladies join in and then they help the drummers.

(Do the songs have words too?)

Yes, there are quite a few songs that have words to them.

(In Kiowa or what?)

Yes, the Kiowas put the words in the songs and they have meaning to them.

(Are there some other languages that have words too, like Comanches?)

Un-huh, Comanches have words in their songs.

(What about Apaches?)

...and also Apaches, they have words in their songs. But the Apaches have real pretty Forty-Nine songs, but I don't know a one. I have heard them, but I don't know a one.

(Oh, you don't. Do you know the tunes?).

Yeah, I know the tunes, but as far as singin' 'em, I wouldn't know how to start off one.

(Well, don't some of the songs, do they have words in English too?)
