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(What do you usually see?)

Well, you usually see jeans--blue jeans, pedal pushers, and maybe a few of them wearing shorts and usually then, say about, etude. 25 or 30 of the girls wear dresses.

Uh-nuh, they still link arms, but it's not as good as it is when it's dark!

(Why?)

I don't know--seems like that you can't see your feet in it.

(Do they like to have it really dark, or how about moonlight?)

Uh-nuh. Moonlight's even better.

(It is?)

Uh-h.

(You know you were saying while ago that in the old days there used to dance two in a blanket, you know these cotton blankets--would you explain that more?)

Well, usually it's boy and girl. They dance together like that. They wanta make sure that nobody else gets in.

(You mean gets in between them?)

Gets in between them. Uh-nuh.

(Well, are they trying to hide from other people too?)

Yeah. Lot of times, this boy could be dancing with this girl and maybe somebody else likes him, but he likes the girl that he's with, so he just wants to keep it that way.

(Well, does he--is it the boy that usually puts the blanket around the two of them or does the girl do it too?)

Well, the girl does that most of the time.
