That's out east of Carnegie, about 3 miles east of Carnegie. "Cornbread's Corner" is named after Cornbread. Cornbread's a Kiowa man. His grandfather was Apache. Medicine Man. He's still livin' now.

(Cornbread is still livin'?)

And Greg's Corner was named after Gregory Haumpy. He took his girl out there, which was his wife later on after that, and I don't know, I never have been out to "Square Top."

(What kind of place is that?)

I don't know--I never have been out there.---

(Well, these other places are they just out on the road?)

Uh-huh, there out there on the road, side of the road.

(And they just dance right in the road?)

Right in the middle of the road. Uh-huh.

(Doesn't anybody come by?)

Well, there never used to be anybody come by, but now and then---the laws' goin' to pick you up if you're at one of them places.

(They do?)

Uh-huh, if you're just parked there, they'll pick you up.
