Oh, boy, here comes another bunch over there. (Sings another song) Big excitement to me. I was standing there and I had a little bucket in my hand. I remember. That's where we going to go to dinner. Where they have a big dinner, we going to go join in with them and they give me something in there, you know. I carry that bucket around. Yeah, they give me rice, sweet rice, with...fruit and lots of good stuff. I was little boy about ten years old. That was the last good Sundance. Last good Sundance I saw. That was 1888 that was the year of 1888. And I remember, I figure. So that's the way it goes. I just started on the way the Sundance is going on and I go right in through the midst where they dance, and what they do. I go around Grandma, great-Grandma, carry me around.

(How many people pledged that year?)

Where?

(At the Oak Grove Sundance?)

Oh, I could tell about. Oh, big bunch of them seven thousand people.

In those days there was lots of Kiowas. You understand?

(I am not sure if he understood my question since he apparently gave me the total number of people who attended the Sundance that year.) Yeah

lots of people at that time, but now at this time they are gone, yeah.

Yeah, they go over there and join. Join the Sundance, people going over there sort of like worship. They worship that Sundance medicine. That's
