Mrs. H: (In background of tape.) Now this Ghost Dance a lot of these Indians went crazy but he wouldn't admit it. He wouldn't believe that somebody you loved, your mother, your father, your brother, or somebody that's close to you that dies, they believe you go to this Ghost Dance and sing all that you have and dance all you have. These will appear to you and talk to you just keep that one certain person in mind. That's what he told me but he wouldn't tell you that today. I tried to get him to tell you three times why but I noticed he wouldn't say. But that's the reason why the Government put a stop to these Ghost Dances, these Indians just loosening their minds. Did he tell you about Mr. Mooney and the peyote?

PEYOTE:

(No) (Do you want to hear that?) (Yeah.)

Grandpa, tell him about Mr. Mooney when he stayed with you all at the mountains. And you all went to this Peyote meeting the first time Mr. Mooney went to this Peyote meeting and he lost his diamond ring. Tell him that story about that James Mooney the first time he went to a Peyote meeting with you all.

Mr. BG: No, James Mooney was a some kind of a man who was working for the Government and he's been coming over there often but this other bunch the one that lost the ring that was his name was James Gott (?).

Mrs. H: Oh, O.k.
