That medicine I threw at Bigbow said bust that thing into. Then I was ready for him when he said that bowstring broke he said, "Good-bye." Then I punched him in the stomach. He said, "I kill him and I scalp him." And he said, "That ain't the only time that it ever happened. It always happened but I always get by. I know how to get by on account of my medicine." He's a big medicine man and a big chief, Grandpa Heidsick.
