(Yeah. Is that going to be at -- is that going to be at noon, and then run all afternoon?)

Yeah, they're going to have dinner at noon. We have -- we had pretty good size crowd yesterday, But I guess some of them people went to that pow-wow they had down Walters.

(Yeah.)

Well, maybe, you went?

(No, I didn't.)

Well, but they say it would be pretty hot over there. It's about like here.

(Yeah, yeah. Well, the Apaches -- Apaches dance -- the Apaches have theirs in two weeks.)
