I don't know this game was, let's see, when we, it was about when they play hand game when I saw it, you know, play. They have a, my uncle used to, you know, kind of have it. Sometimes, he have it on New Year's eve. He put that game on. Maybe, him and his uncle, you know, they -- they play the game.

(Yes.)

It's his uncle. Look like corn had something to do with it. Corn, you know, they used kind of corn, but that way, they use. When they start, you know, they got to have a little ceremony, you know.

(Yeah.)

Somebody has to ask that man, you know, to make the game come out right.
