Well, they score two.
(They get two sticks?)
Yeah. And then, sometimes, you know, maybe, they find one. Well, they pick up one -- .

(If the -- if they guess one, what about the one that they guess? Do they pick -- does the -- ?)

(No score, (not clear) they just get them.)
No score, you know, they just get them and take them on their side. They take them on their side again. Maybe, somebody guess both of them again, they just keep, you know, see-saw; you know, back.
(Yeah, yeah.)
Yeah, one time they took them people that knows how to guess, you know, he, he can get them. He can almost tell, you know.
(How -- how do they tell?)
What?
(When somebody's guess, you know, like if you're guessing, what do youtwhat do you look for when you make your gress? You know what I mean? You.
