He was just slicing that meat and hanging it up. And pretty soon that panther came, and he said, "Hey Sainday," he said, "I've come after my kids." He said, "Your kids are too lazy. They don't hustle! They don't do nothing!" he said. "They're/no good," he said. "Take them back. I want mine back." That was a short story right there.
