brother was going to school there before I was old enough to go to school. (And your mother's name was Chop-pae?)

Yes.

(And your father?)

David Poafpybitty

(And White Wolf, was he...)

My mother's father.

(Do you know who your father's father was?)

Yeh, his name was Hah-vee-wake--ee. He ain't got no English name cause he died way before everything was settled. He died way many years ago.

(And what was his name again?)

Hah-vee-wake-ee.

(Was he Comanche?)

Yes, he was a Comanche. I think he's a Comanche and half Kiowa. They said his mother was a Kiowa woman but my grandmother was Arapahoe...my mother's mother. She was Arapahoe.

(What was her name?)

Sahn-ah-pia.

(Was she the one that took care of you a lot?) Yes.

(Did you live with your grandmother?)

We all lived together over there, my grandmother and my mother's sister. My mother's sister never was married.

(What other things did the children do at Cache Creek Mission School?) They played ball, you know baseball, they played that, they have all kinds of games they played, and then they have football, the older ones. They would match up with the Ft. Sill school up here by Lawton, you know that big school. They would match up a team with them and they'd go up there and they played with them. The older peoples but not the young ones.
