They getting that tax return they call it. They getting tax return on their money, I guess. But I didn't get any. I'm the only one..the only unlucky person. (Laughs)

(Was this money given to people for the land?)

A long time ago they used to give some kind of a money. They call it annuity money.

(I think I know. It was repayments for the land that was taken away from you.)

Yea. We were getting it every year. We get my three year payment for so much but it ran out you know. Long time ago, and see how much we supposed to get I guess and what's left, the balance, they payed us off
