And then people got the money break camp and go home. Then they have money. They give little ones (referring to 8 year old grandson) like him and from babies on up. So funny new born babies born that day or that night or something like that..why they get paid. There some parties have more children why they get more money.

(Grandson: We got some not long ago. \$197.00. All the Kiowas, Comanches, and Apaches.)

Did each family get this?)

Grandson: Yea, everybody.)

He got his and I got mine and his old man got his. (According to conversation at this point all members in a family received this money with exception of small children i.e. under their teens)

(Grandson: Some of them Pawnees got \$5,000 a piece.)

Why did they get so much?)

There's not very many of them. And they don't have too much children.

They got pretty good.
