I was over there one time, about two years ago. They were just where the little creek comes up, they ere camped, you know. At that time when they killed Black Kettle over there.. The way I heard. He had white, you know white on flag this Black Kettle and he got a pole and hung it up, this white flag, and it don't mark anything. He never done that, but he did over here when Custer's fight them Indians, you know. Over here south of Wagoner, yeah, most of them got killed over there. I had a book of it, but one fellow took it over here to Montana, he's over there yet, and my book is over there yet. They got all the names of the kin, you know, they got a big book, you know, all them people got names on them, they all got them names on them. All of them. And so anyway, my father after they 'us down, he sign on it. Sign it to it. And this fellow had it over there, and he died last June 24. And I sent word to try to send my book back, they might bring it back if they got it yet. I wish they were. Maybe we going to get money out of it. That's why I want to get my book back, you know. 'Cause my brother...my father, I mean my father's brother was killed there right at the same time. All the Indians you know, got killed and we're going to get the money off of
