

time that they make that treaty, you know. Five different tribes, the Cheyenne, and Arapaho, and Comanches, and Kiowas, and I can't tell who this other bunch is. See, they make up the treaty, you know, over there, then they move. These Cheyennes, they want to pick out their place somewhere they can locate it. So they have agent there, you know. So they start off from Medicine Lodge, and come over to west of Woodward. They thought they was going to find that place over there. Ft. Supply what they called it. But they stayed there two or three days, start off again, come down on this road. On this river, you know. Find a good place where they can put the agent in there. They went way down to the northwest of El Reno, they used to call it Darlington. They said they found a place for him to put the agent in there. They call it Darlington. Then they got a school there. The Arapahoes had a school house in there. And the Cheyenne had theirs here where Concho is. They have big house, and it's a school, you know. So the children, they put them all the Cheyennes, you know, I was there too in 1895. I was in there, I was just a little boy.

SCHOOL AT CONCHO:

When I was in school in 1895 or 94 (At this point Jay's daughter Jennie, interrupts and feels she too had to tell her father what to tell.) When I was a little boy and I was in school at that time, down there, Darlington was near El Reno, and west of that you had they had a agent there, and they had the Arapaho school right there. And ours, they had up there near Concho. They used to call it Cheyenne School. There was a new agent there, there was an agent there at Darlington. And there was just a school up there, they had big
