

they plant there you know, and sometimes we go down there and steal some apples. The Arapaho boys, they'd chase us off. Oh, we had all kinds of fights, you know. Fight with the Arapaho boys. Oh, my they were...they treat us pretty good, at school. I couldn't tell you what year was the railroad come through there, go through from Concho to El Reno, the Rock Island, I don't know what year was it. I know the railroad was right there in '95, 1895, before I went to school at Lawrence Kansas. We went over there, I was over there, I had two or three boys with me. Lawrence, Kansas. Oh, they got big school over there.

(At this point Jay got tired and started to go to sleep. His daughter and son-in-law had come over to listen, and when the old man started to go to sleep, they began to talk about the "Arrow Worship Time", which was to be held near Sam Buffalo's place at Seiling. It was supposed to begin on the 14th of July, but by that day, they hadn't set up camp yet.)

(What will go on these three or four days that you're over at Seiling?)

I don't think a white should know. (Jennie.)

JAMES DISCUSSING WHAT THE WHITE MAN HAS DONE TO THE INDIAN:

Well, it's all right, I think they can know, but it's a secret a secret. It's something good, you know, they had it before you white people come across here. They had this tipi. This outfit right here, what's inside, they got that at Bear Butte over there. In the United States. Something way better than you white people around here can try for. Natvie Indian had all this, and some way the white man come in here and take over, our money, good farm place, deer, fish, everything. You have to have license. See, just like white people coming in here
