(What sort of work did you have to do while you were in school?)

Just practical, just the general practical work that any Indian school required.

:(Did you do things like making beds and cleaning?)

Oh yes, as soon as we got up we had to make our beds and then report for chapel service.

(Did you have any special things to do at school that was your job like cooking for example?)

Well, I worked in the sewing room and then I worked in the bakery. Those two projects that I followed all the way through.

(Did they pay you for that?)

No, see that was just part of the training. Which was really good, I think that was one of the best of course it was under the military system, and then we had to well, that'll come in later after I left the non-reservation school.

(Did you get enough to eat while you were over at the school?)

Oh sure. We had plenty to eat.

(What about at home? Did you have any special jobs to do?)
