

(Was that pretty regular that people would go to live with their wife's family?)

Yes, with their wife's family. Their parents until they got established for themselves.

(Would they for example stay there until they had children?)

Yes, uhuh. That was the main purpose. That they could give them guidance for rearing children.

(And what would happen after they had children?)

Well, most generally they just had one child or so. Then if they had another place to move to then they all go out and then go for their own just like they do now. Wherever employment was available for the husband. That's where they went, which was mostly farm labor at that time.

(Do people usually live in their own houses when they get married today?)

For example if a man and a woman get married today, do they go to live in their own house?)

Oh yes, uhuh. They do just like the white people because most of them are all employed. And when there's a marriage of any kind, then when they go and establish their own home and generally there's already a home ready for them. For any young married couples now-a-days.

NEIGHBORLY AID:

(Does the tribe do anything for them when they get married?)

No, nothing special now. There's relatives. They give them a shower. Just like white people we don't have no special thing or service or anything.

(What if something bad happens to people? For example, what if their house burns down, does anyone come to help them?)
