Well, the Wichita call it He Ah Wish. I don't know what that mean, He Ah Wish, but that's what they call it, He Ah Wish.

(Will you say that again?)

(Wichita Indian word) That's an early spring race, you know.

(Yeah.)

They just have it once a year.

(Yeah.)
