he makes knots on it, you know on the arrow. I never did see nobody make them like that. I tell you, my uncle, he made some for one man, oh, this man that passed away. (Monroe.) Monroe, yeah, he made some for Ralph. (Yeah.) Then, he made some for called name, Tom Keyes. He made some. I should have told him, "Make me, some," you know. (Yeah.) He probably--I don't know. I think he made some for one of them boys. (Yeah.) Boy, he's a---(Yeah.) I don't think, I never did, I saw lot of arrows, you know, them big bow made. (Yeah.) See, now, these arrows they used to make, you know, sometime my dad, he put them in the teepee and dye them, season them. (Yeah.) He had them, you know, oh, for long time, maybe, I guess, they harden up, you know. (Yeah, yeah.) They harden up. That's about all in that. Then, in this buffalo hunt, or anything else; but the buffalo hunt, he told me they use little bitty arrows about that long, you know, little bitty short arrows. Probably, that bow has to be, you know--it won't be, you know, take too long. Had to be probably about that long. So, we--I guess, he's 'the one that done
