Oh. (Or what kind of bird?) I don't think they use eagle, probably hawk. (Hawk?) Turkey. Just any kind of feather, I guess. (Yeah.) Probably crow, you know, any kind, that's any kind feather. (Yéah.) But I don't think they used eagle feather. You know, kind of--might as well say it's kind of against the law, you know, for my tribe to use, birds like that, you know. (Yeah.) Eagle, they couldn't use eagle feather. Hawks---(Didn't they ever use eagle feathers for anything?) Not on arrows. (No, not just on arrows, huh?) -They don't use them on arrows. They use them on---(Yeah, yeah. You said--you said that there were three feathers, right? On that end like that?) Yeah, you got it right. (How--how did they attach the feather to the arrow?) What? (How did they attach the feather to the arrow?) Well, they start, you see, well, they knew how to make them, you know. They--see, they got that sinew in their mouth, you know. (Yeah.)
