tie it right here, tie it right here. Maybe, four or five times, you tie them. Then, you hang them, you know. I don't know how long. Then you go back, and you have to kind of keep check on them, you know.

They stay straight that way.

(Yeah.)

They don't--arrows pretty put them on.

(Yeah, yeah. Did they--did they have any kind of straightener?)
No.

(For an arrow, any kind of thing they use to straightened them?)

Yeah, they--well, the way my dad, you know, straightened. He use that

mouth; you know. He uses his mouth.

It got a little crook in there, you know. You can get it out, you know.

They puts it in his mouth.

(I'm still not -- I'm still not sure about, you know, you said your dad decorated his arrows. He painted them? Could you tell a little more?

I still don't understand how--what that look like, that print, that design he put on.)

Oh, he, he uses a knife.

(I see.)

Yeah, he--he uses a knife, you know, kind of--(Is this--is this the top here?)

• Yeah, .yeah.

(Yeah.)

Cut it like that like a--like a--oh, he just carves it, you know, with a knife. Then, he puts his, you know, paint on there whenever he wants to
