(You mentioned once that when they this dance, it would be after the warriors came back from the war parties. Were there any other dances that were done in place of the turkey dance?)

That was official. That was the dance that had to be done after the warriors came.

(Was it always done or was...?)

See, prior to the time that the warriors went, they always had that big Osage. It's where they went from camp to camp like I told you. They had that drum and you know, in the middle and everybody followed the warriors and then in the camp whoever had anything that they could you know give, such as food, and such stuff, each person carried a certain amount of provisions. So if they had to get away in a hurry or something, regardless of the..each person carried their own always provisions so that way they were not out at any time. There was always supplies on each person that went out since they had to use it in..and then this deal was in the first part of the turkey dance. They Big Osage, like the last part of that, well that really should have been you know, they go from camp to camp and sing and all the ones that wish to donate, and then they'd divide the goods up among them. That's the way. That's they way go size them up and whoever had moccassins, they really it the mocassin dance. (Caddo name) Yeah, that's the proper name,...That's the way they say it.

(Is that the name that the Caddo use for it today too?)

Yes, they call it (Caddo name). That means that they're on the warpath. Like for instance, if somebody came and practically jumped on to me, if
