And they always was fancy leggings put on there, you know. They'd have a little ruffle all decorated and with embroidery or either some part of a shell. You know, they used a lot of that.

(How long is the apron supposed to be today?)

Even with the dress.

(Is it supposed to be any special color?)

No, it just depends on who the individual is. How they make them and so on.

(What about mocassins? Do the Caddo ever wear those long mocassins?)

No. They're always, ...see this the woodland type of mocassin. All the woodland Indians wear those. Soft-soled mocassins as they're called. All one piece.

(Are these the ones with the flaps?)

Uhuh. Yes. Yeah with the flaps.

(What about leggings? Do people wear leggings?)

Yes, they wore leggings.

(Would that be appropriate to wear today?)
