(Could you say what the words to the song are?)

Yea that's...(sings the syllables of the song) Just a repetition of it. According to the tune.

(OK, I'll play the fifth one?) (Part of the fifth one is played.)

...Well, that's on the same dialect, but it, so that must indicate where they come in. Says, "Come on Yowa." See it says...and then this is ... So that's on that same dialect, but I don't know just what, just where it belongs to what band it belongs. But I understand it so far. It says that they are there and then they're proceeding to dance.

(Uhuh. Are all of these songs so far still in the first part of the dance?)

Uhuh.

(OK, I'll play the sixth one.) (Part of the sixth one is played.)

Kechai.

(This is a Kechai song?)
