originated by the Cheyenne tribe. A fellow by the name of Morrison--and  
I originated this song. Cheyenne flag song. The words to it will mean  
about the boy went over seas during the war time. And this was sang by  
these boys, this song. At this time, we're going to sing the song.

Well, this has been a real old story that Medicine Elk is talking about.  
It was way back, real--way back in the old times.
