Yes..

(Did you go to school after that?)

Yes. I went to the St. Louis School. The Catholic Girls School here in Pawhuska. It's right out here.

(How long did you go there?)

Well, I went there till I finished.

(Finished high school?)

No. Just eight grade.

(How old were you at that time? About fifteen?)

sixteen, maybe seventeen.

(Then you were married shortly after that weren't you?)

Just right after school was out. They had everything ready. I didn't -- You know as I told you, I didn't know anything about it. They just married me off. That was the Osage ruling. The full-blood Osages married their children off. They done their picking themselves. The grooms parents picked the girl.

(What was your husband's name?)
