(How large was the Church that he fixed?)

Well, it was about like your Churches.

(It's a round house?)

Round. Its still there yet. That's where he should go.

(They still hold services there?)

Oh, all the time.

(What did John Wilson do after he fixed the place?)

Well, I wasn't right inside the building where he was, but I was there. We were all there. My father was the one went in, you know. We -- I didn't go inside but I remember them having the dinner the next day and that's when I saw him you know.

(Your father was one of the first members?)

Yes he belonged down there to the Claremore. He was there. He held some kind of office, or something. I don't know what you call it but he was one of the main ones in there. He really believed in that you know.

(Well, did he talk to you about the Church? About their beliefs?)

Yeah. Well, he used to try to get me to try to believe in it. But I
