EDUCATION FOR VARIOUS MEMBERS OF FAMILY - BOARDING SCHOOL

(The very first is not clear. Then begins talking about getting the tape recorder to work...That's the thing--come on let's...)

I went to (not clear) to boarding school which...

(It was a boarding school?)

Boarding school for Indians

(When did you go there?)

Back in 1907.

(1907? How old were you?)

Seven.

(Did you like it?)

Yes, I liked it. We come home in--believe it was 1910. And we never did go back. They had a school house built right there, near my father's house, named Grant school--is where I went to school and got my education. That's where I learned how to speak English. ((laughter))

(You learned in 1907 when you went to school?)

I guess I did. ((laughter)) I don't remember 'till I--

(How many children were there in your family?)

Well there was, let's see, four. Well, now there'd be 5 but 4 in the first marriage--and second--but I have a half sister. She's dead, too.

(How many went to school?)

Just us three. Two girls and one boy.

(How many people were at the school were there?)

Oh, there were--I don't know how it was but there--the boys stayed in one
