Oh, that time I was telling, at Ray's house, on the east side. I don't know how old I was. But I know well that it was Rabbit Dance. And this old man he was sitting over there, that time, had knife. This old man, that's Stewart's daddy, Sam Klinekole. This one, he's kind of a jolly fellow, you know. He tease or something like that. Yea, last time I seen Rabbit Dance. (Who was the other man, the one that sang?)

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I wouldn't know now who was the other man. I wouldn't know. (Could anybody lead that dance?)

When they want to get out of that dance? (No, could anybody run one, or did it have to be some special person?) No, no no. Could be anybody. Anybody. Yea, he could run it. Yea, we used to have a lot of fun on that. I been to, I know of three times..course I might be there ;before when I was pretty young, but since I know better, why I know all about. That's how come I know, how they been running that Rabbit' Dance.

(Were there any other dances for kids?)

That's all the dances I know of. Course, they some other dances, like the Blackfoot or any other kind that children could dance too. But somebody told me that they used to don't allow children at that Blackfoot. They don't allow children there, not men and women, but now, everythings changed, and they don't allow dogs, too, in that Blackfoot. If you see Stewart (Klinekole) sitting over there with arrow, they tell us that a dog come he has to shoot it. Kill it, take it out..have to because that lodge have to...

HORSE SOCIETY:

(Have you ever watched the dance they call litidie?) No, never did.

(Did you ever hear anything about that?)
