(Did you ever get the money?)

Yeah. We got it finally, but we had to use the lawyer. The lawyer took half of the money because he didn't fix no papers, see. If he had fixed deeds you know, it'd been all right. Wouldn't had to use no lawyer. But they said he had some papers when he died byt couldn't find them. Say he had a lotta money stored away at the Chickasha Bank. But we never did find out you know, how true. We never did find out. It's gone. He buried out there. I got a cemetery out here--my own.

(Is the old man buried out there?)

Yeah. He buried out there. They name his George Washinton. See them people that find him. They name was Washington. But I don't know how they give 'em name but that's their name. The last name--Washington.

And they call him George Washington. They didn't know who was his parents. Said he had one sister living but he didn't know whether she got killed or someone got her. Said he didn't know.

LEASING OF LAND:

(Do you lease your land now?)

Yeah. We used to farm but after these tractors come in well, we don't farm no more.

(What did you used to grow?)

Grow cotton and corn and feed--maize. But I lease it now. White man's farming it. White man's cheating me out of it. (laughs) No. White man's farming my place.

(I think that's really interesting to note. The Indians owned this land originally. The white man comes in and he has to have a lease from the Indians.)

(Daughter: Now on this side most of 'em farm their own. But I don't
