Uhuh. Had to put them on. I could stand on my hair, because I had long hair then. I guess it didn't look right in Indian costume. I went through with it, about morning they dressed me up. Tried to put me on the horse, but the horse wouldn't stand still. So I had to walk.

(Did you leave horse, I mean did you just leave him behind?)

Yeah, I leave horse, they pick him up. That's what white people call honeymoon, I guess. We stay two nights in that camp sight, two nights and then--
