

(Where did you get this yellow paint?)

Oh, I think they got it in Five Cent stores now, I think they got it in little jars. I think you could get that and then paint it all yellow the smoked kind and they're pretty after you paint it yellow. That's the color the Comanches wear, but now these young womans they got white moccasins. They get soiled too quickly and they're sure hard to clean. You got to scrape it all over and then put that powder on it. A little water and put powder on it and then after it commence to dry you got to scrape it all little to make it soft again. It's so hard to keep clean. You have to wear it when it's real dry, you know because any little damp weather sure gets the moccasins wet and stiff all around the feet, you know and on the sides.

MAKING QUILTS:

(What else did your grandmother teach you?)

Oh, to sew and to quilt tops you know. I was pretty good size, about five years old when she..she always be sewing something you know and everyday she's got something to sew, and she'd make quilt tops. She just make squares you know. In them days they didn't know nothing about pretty patterns they got now, but she just make them straight and cut them in blocks and then she'd sew those and put another piece through here and then another one like that here. She'd put all her quilt tops over an old blanket and then she would sew it together the lining together and that old blanket and then she would put that top over it and just you know, she don't do it like quilting she just tack it like that in places. On the row she would tack it and tie it here in a knot when she put that thread through here you know, just like she tacks it about that far apart. With yarn, or you know, with a heavy thread.
