(Did the older women wear those top?)

Yes. Older women wear those, but the older ones, they wear moccasins all the time. They come to church...everybody comes to church up there and they would come to those prayer meetings on Wednesday night and then on Sundays, all the Indians. Oh, a bunch of them would come... some in wagons on Sunday mornings. Then we all go to church. When I was about ten years old, we all go to Sunday school and I just thought all the time we was just going to school and they was trying to teach us something, but all the time they was learning us about the Bible and things like that.

(This was at the Mission School?)

Yes. The kids, we used to...when she tell us about how Jesus was born and we just laugh and act silly and our matron would say, "Don't laugh." Then we ask her, "Did you see the baby?" You know things like that...the older girls and us. Ask her questions like that. We just laugh about it. All the time we thought it was just silly for them not to go and see the baby when it was born because she said everybody went and seen the baby.

(When I was asking you about the clothing, were you describing the clothes you wore at Ft. Sill or at the Mission?)

At the Mission. I never went to this other school at Ft. Sill.

(And you don't remember anything about the type of clothes you wore when you were at Ft. Sill?)

When I was a baby?

(Yes)
