(Did your grandmother ever tell you any stories about life at Ft. Sill?)

When she was young. No. I don't believe she ever did tell me anything. She told me all kinds of old stories but she never did tell me nothing about Ft. Sill.

(Did they ever teach you anything other than the Bible at this Mission School?)

Yes. They learn us how to write and read.

(How old were you when you got married?)

I was seven years old and I stayed there ten years in school. I went to school ten years, and I was seventeen when I got out of school and that year I got married.

MARRIAGE:

(Could you tell me something about THE courtship what we call dating now?)

No, I never did go around with any mens like that...till I was married. You know my brother, he was chumming around with this young boy, he was about nineteen, and he went to Ft. Sill School and my brother he go down there and he come home with him all the time and finally that summer when the school was out he brought him home to our house up here and he stayed with us all summer, and my mother said, "You better get married to this boy, he's a nice boy, and he always be helping with everything and he might work for us if you get married to him." I didn't have sense enough to... I think nothing about love or anything like that. So I said, "If he wants to marry me, I'll marry him. So my mother ask him, "Do you want to marry my daughter?" and he said, "Yeah, I'll marry her." And that was the way I got married to him.
