(Did they separate themselves from the others?)

Here not to long ago they tried to separate us from the Kiowa and Apaches, but...of, we had a time...for five years or six years they tried. The whole Comanche tribe, that's us including the full blood Comanches separated. How could we separate from the Kiowa and Apaches? Our youngsters now grown up they marry into the Kiowa. They get half-Kiowa, half Comanche children. My own self...my nephews childrens are half Kiowas.

(Who are they?)

They live around Carnegie. The boys, one of them married and he got two kids from a Kiowa woman and then those two boys, their grandmother and their grandpa are Kiowas and me over here, I'm their grandmother too. I don't see how they could separate us.

(Who is trying to separate you?)

Those people around Walters. We call them half-breeds. They act too much like white peoples. They try to live like white peoples. Can't do it, because they live among the Comanches. When you see them around town, they don't hello or anything to you. They just pass you by.

(Do they consider themselves Comanches?)

Yes. They Comanches. They all on the Comanche roll with us. There suppose to be Comanches, but they all half-breeds.
