(How many acres do you have?)

I have 160 acres right here. Got some more up there at Cache.

I don't know how many. Me and my kids we got that. Me and my brother we got this way back in here. I got interest in with them too. I don't know how many acres.

(Do you lease your land for cash? Or for crops?)

Cash. We don't mess with crops. We ain't got nothing to feed. Ain't got no family no more.

(Do you get pretty good income from your leases?)

Yes. We get pretty good income. But they just pay us once a year. Around January we get our lease money, next January we get another lease money. Every January. That's a long time a part, is't it? Can't hardly get the money from our lease mans. They supposed to pay us in January or Christmas we get it.

(How long do you lease it for?)

About three years, or two years. Five years. Five years is the highest, you can't go over that.

(Is this set by the Indian Agency?)

Yes.

(Do you ever have trouble trying to collect your rent?)

No. They pay you right now when you lease your place. As soon as you sign papers with them, they pay you. They can't say no because they lease it from you. They got to pay you.
