BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Birdie Burns was in her mid-sixties during the time of these interviews. She was born and riased in the Clinton area, by traditionally oriented parents and knews a great many old time stories and much information about the former Cheyenne way of life. Her father was Kias, a sub-chief or band chief. Her mother was named Sage Woman. Her mother's father (or her mother's father's brother) was High Backed Wolf. Birdie was raised in the Mennonite Church. Her father was a peyotist for a while, but gave this religion up when his son, Birdie's brother died. Birdie has been married to Ed Burns for many years, and they have one son. She also has a son by a previous marriage. (2-23-72)
