I don't know, they--I just don't know. They go to different places. Around here.

(Did your mother make moccasins and do bead work?)

(Oh yeah. She never done no bead work, but she made moccasins. She use to tan them and make moccasins. But she never does no bead work.

(Did some of the other Kickapoo women do bead work?)

Oh yeah, my sister did. My sister that died, she made--she sure knew how to do bead work.

(Where did she learn that?)

Oh, she learned it from women when she was a little girl. Mother said she sued to go around to meighbors and go and watch them and she start beading.

She learned it off of them Indians.

(Where did they get their hides at?)

Oh, they kill deers.

## HUNTING

(Were there deer around here?)

Oh, there were lots of deers. So they have their own deers and -- oh, they didn't have their own deers -- there was lots of wild deers.

(Did they use bow and arrows?)

I think they did. Uh huh, yeah, they had bow and arrows, that time. But later they had guns, when white people came, they even gave them guns--gave the Indians guns.

(Did your dad ever used to hunt?)

I don't know. I don't think so.

(Did your father ever hunt?)

I don't think so.

(Did any of the other men hunt?)

Yeah, my younger -- my brothers did. That time when I knew, there wasn't no
