(Did your mother and father go over there?)

My--yeah, they went. But they didn't join. They just went to it. They just went because -- to go over there and eat. That's Indians -- likes to eat!

(Yeah, white people do too.)

See, they give us big dinner over there. We went over there every Sunday.

(Do they give them dinner every Sunday?)

Uh huh. They cook big dinner, them church people. There were nothin' but womens there. They cook, and they always have a big crowd. But you can't get big crowd in these churches anymore, like they use to.

(Why did they quit cooking?)

Uh huh. Yeah, that's it. We have big crowd. We had big crowd Sunday. We had a big crowd here. We had a big dinner yesterday. We just don't hardly do no Indian things anymore.

## RELATIONS WITH WHITES THEN AND NOW

(What were the white people like back then? Did you have friends--white friends?)
Oh, yeah. We had lots of--

(Troubles or anything?)

No, we didn't we had lots of good friends with white people. But seem like-now we don't have much. They all different and all the old folks are dying
out you know--our friends you know. They used to be real nice.

(Well, what's the difference in what it was and what it is today?)

Well, the old white people that lived way in the back, they know just about how Indians lived and just know about Indians you know, and what Indians like. And maybe they go and bring something. I know they use to bring daddy maybe some whole turkey and cakes, something like that—food you know. And that's when they're good friends. So that's when the liked their neighbors. I know lots of them treat them nice. But now days they kind of make fun of you now. They kind of make—remarks you know. They're not so crazy about Indians
